1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11 11	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE COMMISSION ON EDUCATION AND ECONOMIC COMPETITIVENESS TO DEVELOP A VISION FOR MISSISSIPPI'S FUTURE ECONOMY AND CONSIDER HOW TO REFORM EDUCATION TO PREPARE ALL STUDENTS FOR THAT FUTURE; TO DEVELOP INITIAL LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE 2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION; TO DEVELOP OMNIBUS LEGISLATION TO INTRODUCE DURING THE 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION; TO ESTABLISH COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS BETWEEN MISSISSIPPI'S EARLY CHILDHOOD, K-12, HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SYSTEMS INTO A WORLD-CLASS SYSTEM THAT PREPARES ALL STUDENTS FOR SUCCESS IN WORK AND LIFE BY ADDRESSING CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION, CURRICULUM AND ASSESSMENT, FOUNDATIONS OF SUPPORT, AND GOVERNANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY TO SUPPORT THIS SYSTEM; TO DEVELOP A PLAN FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROPOSED OMNIBUS LEGISLATION; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDING TO PROCURE THE SELECTION OF A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATION WITH EXPERTISE IN INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION BENCHMARKING, FACILITATION, AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND EXTENSIVE EXPERIENCE WITH MISSISSIPPI'S EDUCATION SYSTEM TO FACILITATE THE COMMISSION'S MEETINGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI
21	SECTION 1. (1) There is established an independent
22	research-based Commission on Education and Economic
23	Competitiveness, which shall assess and provide:
24	(a) A vision for education and workforce development

- 28 (c) A set of recommendations based on that global 29 analysis derived from the data acquired under paragraph (b) to 30 enable Mississippi's education system to attain world-class levels 31 of performance, by establishing collaborative partnerships between 32 early childhood, K-12, postsecondary education and workforce 33 development systems that prepare all students for success in work 34 and life by addressing career and technical education, curriculum 35 and assessment, foundations of support, and governance and 36 accountability;
- 37 (d) The development of initial legislative 38 recommendations for the 2024 Regular Session of the Mississippi 39 Legislature;
- 40 (e) Recommendations for omnibus legislation for the 41 2025 Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature, to address 42 those recommendations presented to the Legislature in 2024; and
- 43 (f) A plan for beginning and overseeing the initial 44 phases of implementation of the legislation.
- 45 (2) (a) The commission shall select a national consulting
 46 and professional learning organization with expertise in
 47 internationally benchmarking the policies and practices of
 48 high-performing education systems and translating those policies
 49 and practices into United States contexts to facilitate the

53	(i) Share information and insights on the design
54	of high-performing education systems, organized around a coherent
55	framework that looks across these systems;
56	(ii) Analyze Mississippi's state education,
57	workforce development, and economic context against this

59	(iii) Facilitate conversations that allow the

61	1. Establish a long-term vision;
62	2. Establish a forward agenda based on the

- 124 (a) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days (4)125 after the effective date of this act. The commission shall hold its first meeting before August 1, 2023. The Chairmen of the House 126 and Senate Education Committees shall serve as the inaugural 127 128 co-chairmen of the commission, thereafter the Chairmen of the House and Senate Workforce Development Committees shall serve as 129 130 co-chairmen for the immediate successive year, followed by the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees serving 131 132 as co-chairman for the third year of the commission's establishment. Beyond the first three (3) years, the designation 133 of the commission's co-chairmen shall repeat the same cycle of 134 135 service, however the Vice Chairmen of the respective House and
- (b) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum. In the adoption of the rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority of the members shall be required. All members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, such notices shall be mailed at least five (5) days before the date on which a meeting is to be held.

Senate Committees shall serve as co-chairmen.

- 143 (c) The commission shall conclude its business no later 144 than June 30, 2027, and shall be dissolved on July 1, 2027.
- 145 (5) The commission may choose to conduct its business by
 146 dividing into subcommittees, and, at the discretion of the
 147 commission's chairman, appoint additional members with relevant
 148 expertise to the subcommittees.

- 153 (7) To effectuate the purposes of this section, any
 154 department, division, board, bureau, committee or agency of the
 155 state or any political subdivision thereof, shall, at the request
 156 of any member of the commission, provide such facilities,
 157 assistance, information and data as will enable the committee to
 158 properly carry out its duties.
- SECTION 2. All costs and expenses incurred by the Commission on Education and Economic Competitiveness in procuring the selection of a national consulting and professional learning organization shall be paid out of any funds which are made available upon appropriation by the Legislature.
- 164 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 165 and after July 1, 2023.
